Inform

We offer information, advice, referrals, workshops and forums on all HIV-related issues across HIV prevention, diagnosis, treatment and healthcare.

Advocate

We advocate on HIV-related public policy issues across the social determinants of health, and promote the emerging health and wellbeing needs of all people living with HIV in NSW.

Represent

We represent the interests of all people living with HIV in NSW with government, clinical care, community and research bodies, in legislation and public health policy.

Services

Housing Support for all people living with HIV to find and maintain stable accommodation, including anyone at risk of homelessness.

Ageing Support for all people living with HIV over the age of 45 years, to navigate and access the aged care, disability and health services so we can maintain our own independence for as long as possible.

Aboriginal Health Program run by and for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people living with HIV to support other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people living with or at risk of acquiring HIV, in culturally-safe ways.

Employment Support for all people living with HIV to find training or get into study, volunteer or paid work (full-time, part-time or casual).

Treatments Support for all people living with HIV including our partners, family and friends affected by HIV across the NSW metropolitan and regional areas.

Digital Mentors welcomes all people living with HIV to build your digital skills, digital literacy and confidence using computers, mobile devices and the internet with others living with HIV.

Partner Notification supporting you when you're ready to talk with partners or tell others about your own HIV or sexually transmitted infection (STI) diagnosis.

Peer Support & Referrals by and for all people living with HIV to navigate and access a range of NSW-based services.

Positive Speakers Bureau to put a face to what it means to live with HIV as we share our stories and experiences of living with HIV with schools, universities and a range of organisations throughout NSW.

Social support groups

Social Support Groups run by and for all people living with HIV to connect, make new friends and grow our social networks in safe, accessible and inclusive environments.

[+Connect] an inclusive social event for all people living with HIV, our partners, families and friends.

Peers Connect Online! a virtual support and discussion group via Zoom for all people living with HIV, regardless of gender and sexuality. People from rural and regional areas are especially welcome!

The Social Club a monthly support and discussion group that welcomes people who identify as heterosexual living with HIV.

The Women's Room a monthly online support and discussion group for women living with HIV under 35 years of age.

Peer2Peer a support and discussion group held every second month for gay and bisexual men living with HIV.

a[STARTx] a weekend workshop for gay men living with HIV. This program is a partnership between Positive Life and ACON.
