Services

Ageing Support for all people living with HIV over the age of 45 years, to navigate and access the aged care, disability and health services so we can maintain our own independence for as long as possible.

Digital Mentors welcomes all people living with HIV to build your digital skills, digital literacy and confidence using computers, mobile devices and the internet with others living with HIV.

Employment Support for all people living with HIV to find training or get into study, volunteer or paid work (full-time, part-time or casual).

Heterosexual Support by and for heterosexual people living with HIV supporting other heterosexual people living with or at risk of acquiring HIV.

Housing Support for all people living with HIV to find and maintain stable accommodation, including anyone at risk of homelessness.

Partner Notification supporting you when you're ready to talk with partners or tell others about your own HIV or sexually transmitted infection (STI) diagnosis.

Peer Support & Referrals by and for all people living with HIV to navigate and access a range of NSW-based services.

Positive Speakers Bureau to put a face to what it means to live with HIV as we share our stories and experiences of living with HIV interwoven with health promotion messages at schools, universities and a range of organisations throughout NSW.

Treatments Support for all people living with HIV including our partners, family and friends affected by HIV across the NSW metropolitan and regional areas.

Social support groups

Social Support Groups run by and for all people living with HIV to connect, make new friends and grow our social networks in safe, accessible and inclusive environments. Positive Life welcomes anyone across the range of sexuality and gender diverse identities into our social groups.

Peer2Peer a support and discussion group every second month for gay and bisexual men living with HIV.

The Women's Room an online support and discussion group every second month for women living with HIV under 45 years of age.
